Deakin Inspired Minds Program 2018

During weeks 3 and 4 this term, 16 Year 9 and 10 students participated in the Deakin Inspired Minds Program, provided in partnership with Bacchus Marsh Grammar by Deakin University, Burwood.

The Deakin Inspired Minds Program is a challenging and highly rewarding experience, designed to give students in Years 9 and 10 a real taste of what university education involves, beyond the typical 'open day' experience.

The program involved two visits to Deakin's Burwood campus where the students first experienced tertiary-level academic lectures in four faculty areas, followed by a Q&A session with the lecturer later in the week. At school, students worked with the Deakin Student Ambassadors to prepare and research a research question based on the topic of their choice. They developed an understanding of tertiary study skills and academic requirements including: conducting searches of university online libraries; reading academic articles; learning about the aspects of a literature review and how to do Harvard referencing.

All students worked incredibly hard to produce research reports of around 1000-2000 words. They also prepared presentations to accompany the written report, presenting these to parents and staff in Wilson Hall on Wednesday 31 October. Topics covered were: Alpine plants and climate change; ethics and crowdfunding; sleep and athletic performance and the International Indigenous Design Charter.
