


## myBMG Parent Portal Changes



## **Student Well Being**

#### **About Depression**

It's normal for kids to feel sad, down, or irritated, or to be in bad moods from time to time. But when negative feelings and thoughts linger for a long time and limit a child's ability to get on with normal day to day life, it might be depression.

A main sign of depression is when children or young people are sad, discouraged, or irritable for weeks, months, or even longer. Another sign can be being stuck in negative thinking. This can include complaining a lot, focusing on problems and faults, and being really hard on themselves and others.

Depression can affect learning because it interferes with energy, motivation, memory, and concentration. Children and young people with depression may lose interest in activities and schoolwork. They might not realise these struggles are caused by depression and so they can feel like they are stupid, a failure, or a bad student. If your child or young person is struggling with depression, they may seem tired, give up easily, or withdraw from classmates, friends or family. For some young people anger and agitation can also be signs of depression.

It can be hard for parents and other adults to know when a child is depressed. An irritable or angry mood might seem like a bad attitude or disrespect. Low energy and lack of interest might look like laziness or not trying. Depression can make young people feel worthless, rejected, or unlovable. It can make everyday problems seem more difficult than they actually are.

#### **Getting Help**

It is important to realise that depression is not just something someone can snap out of. If you think your child or young person might be struggling with depression, make an appointment for them to see a GP, who will be able to guide you in getting help for your child or young person. Fortunately, depression can get better with the right attention and care. Getting your child the help they need will make them more able to get the most out of their education.

#### More ways parents can help

In addition to advice and help from a GP or counsellor, parents can play an important role, too. At home, these simple but powerful things can help your child deal with depression.

Be sure your child eats nutritious foods, gets enough sleep, and gets daily physical activity. These have positive effects on mood.

Enjoy time together. Spend time with your child doing things you both can enjoy. Go for a walk, play a game, cook, make a craft, watch a funny movie. Gently encouraging positive emotions and moods (such as enjoyment, relaxation, amusement, and pleasure) can slowly help to overcome the depressed moods that are part of depression.

Be patient and kind. When depression causes kids and teens to act grumpy and irritable, it's easy for parents to become frustrated or angry. Remind yourself that these moods are part of depression, not intentional disrespect. Avoid arguing back or using harsh words. Try to stay patient and understanding. A positive relationship with a parent helps strengthen a child's resilience against depression.
