Bacchus Marsh Station update

Major works are continuing on the Ballarat Line Upgrade to enable more frequent and reliable services for thousands of passengers every day.

From Monday 16 September 2019, the current northern construction zone will be expanded to allow for work on the new bus bays and parking spaces near the station building.

The station upgrade includes the construction of 100 new car parking spaces, giving station users more choice.

WHAT WE ARE DOING

Northern car park

The construction zone in the northern car park will be expanded to the west to continue major construction on the station forecourt, bus bays, drop-off zones and car parking.

From Monday 16 September until late September, there will be a reduction in the number of parking spaces at the station.

Please consider how you travel to the station during this period, and use other options such as public transport, cycling or walking if possible.

There will be temporary accessible parking in the eastern car park, with an accessible path available to the station platform.

We'll continue construction on the northern car park and bus bays until mid-November.

We'd like to thank station users for their patience while this work is underway. The temporary disruption to parking will allow us to fast-track completion of the car park works at Bacchus Marsh Station.

Southern car park

The new southern car park is nearing completion.

By the end of September, 155 car spaces will be available on the southern side of the station with access from Parwan Road.

Passengers can access the station building and platforms via the new pedestrian overpass. The overpass will have stairs and ramps on the southern side, and ramps on the northern side.


Work will continue to complete the station upgrade until late 2019.

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

From Monday 16 September until late September, roadworks will be undertaken on Parwan Road to complete the new entrance to the southern car park.

The speed limit will be reduced to 40km/h, with traffic restricted to contra flow for these works.

Please allow extra time and be aware of changed traffic conditions and reduced speed limits for the safety of workers and the public.
