A few things to note: please have a good read of the Prep Information Handbook. The teachers have an official bus list; however, we would appreciate it if you could record bus information in your child's diary as well. Information specific to Maddingley Prep Families

Preps attending Pentland Child Care or YMCA will remain at school to be collected by each of these services.



The remainder of the Preps will be walked to the Gatehouse (main car park) each day to be collected at **2:50pm**. Students who have an older sibling at school can nominate for their Prep child to be collected by this sibling at their later time and the siblings can walk up together (**Year 1:** 2:55pm, **Year 2:** 3:00pm, **Year 3 and 4:** 3:05pm). Please also communicate this to your classroom teacher via the diary.

It is very much appreciated by teachers if parents sign the diary daily and record any changes to normal going home arrangements. Teachers check and sign diaries daily and use this as their primary communication method with parents.

From next week, students will walk down from the Gatehouse without parents. Please be assured, that there will be plenty of staff to direct and support the Prep students with this. For bus travellers, students will also be supported as they alight from their buses each morning.

As we come to the end of Transition Week, I want to extend a huge thank you to you all for your patience and understanding throughout this process. I feel it has been a positive and smooth one. You will receive confirmation of your child's class teacher and room number by the end of week. Subsequently, you will also receive information related to your child's timetable, specialist teachers and general classroom information.

Multimedia Consent for 2021

Annually, the School seeks consent for use of multimedia containing students. This consent is active for a full school year. Next week, parents/guardians will receive an email notification via **Edsmart** to complete their annual consent to multimedia.

Multimedia is defined as photography, video, audio or any other form of electronic recording.

Note: this consent process excludes operational/administrative photography requirements such as Health Centre alerts and ID photos, as well as the annual school photography.

Photography and videography can occur on school premises or off-site at school events, activities, camps and excursions. Multimedia will be collected, used and stored in accordance with the School's <u>Privacy Policy</u>.

This year, the school has expanded the categories of consent to:

• Classroom Activities

Including but not limited to: BMG staff taking photos and displaying student images within the classroom. Photography or videography taken for the purposes of student assessment or educational purposes.

School Publications and School Website

Including but not limited to: Weekly BMG Newsletter (online PDF), weblog articles on the school website, the Grammarian (online and print format), School Yearbook (print format only) and Handbooks (online and print format). Note: the School Yearbook does feature all school class photos.

Advertising/Promotion, Social Media (Facebook) and External Media

Including but not limited to: Advertising, School Facebook posts or posts of those connected to a school activity, school videos, external media (newspapers or similar).

School Production/Musical/Performance or Instrumental Music

Including but not limited to: Photography and videography for promotion and recording of school musicals, productions, theatre or performance.

We request that parents/guardians complete the consent process by **Friday 19 February**. If not completed by the date, students will be marked as DO NOT CONSENT to all categories for 2021.

Scholarships 2022

Bacchus Marsh Grammar offers inclusive Scholarship opportunities to new and current students. On offer in 2022 will be Scholarships available for Academic Excellence at Years 7 and 9. Further to these opportunities are the Callow Access Scholarships for students from Years 7 to 12. These enable students who would otherwise not attend Bacchus Marsh Grammar to attend on a Full Scholarship. Parents of students must be in receipt of a current Health Care Card to qualify for a Callow Access Scholarship and need to provide a copy of the relevant card.

The school is also proud to offer an Indigenous Scholarship, open to current and new students from Years 7 to 12. Indigenous Scholarship applicants must provide a copy of the applicant's Confirmation of Aboriginality document.

The Callow Access and Indigenous Scholarships do not require students to sit an entrance examination. Shortlisted applicants will be interviewed by the Principal, Mr Neal.

Bus Information

Roll Call App

On 22 January, parents were sent a 'Welcome' email from Roll Call for log in activation. Roll Call is for parents whose children travel on private buses. It enables parents to track the bus in real time and receive notification of when their child/ren tap on/off the bus. Roll Call is also for parents whose children do not travel on a bus service, but utilised when students board a bus for school camp, excursion etc. It is advised that ALL parents download the Roll Call App.

If parents require their child to change their AM or PM stop permanently, please contact the School Bus Services Administrator so this can be updated on Roll Call. For the safety of students and drivers, it is very important that stops are up to date on Roll Call. If students are to disembark at a different stop as a one off on their designated route, parents are to update this on Roll Call prior to 1.30pm on the day of travel.

ID Cards

Students will have their photos taken over the next week; once photos are taken students will be issued with their Student ID cards. These ID cards will be used to tap on/off buses. Student ID cards are compulsory for the boarding of a private bus and must be carried at all times. Students who board a bus repeatedly without their Student ID card will receive a detention.

Parent Parking

It is recommend that parents pull off the road into a service road or designated car park whilst dropping off and picking up their child/ren. Parents need to be mindful not to park in the way of a bus and to ensure that the bus has enough space to safely drive in and pull out of the stopping area. Also, as there are bus stops in residential areas, it is important parents not park across residential driveways.

Conveyance Allowance

Applications for the Term 1 claim are due by Friday 12 February

Parents who had a claim in 2020 should receive their application forms in the mail this week. These are due back at the school by Friday 12 February.

Parents who did not submit an application in 2020 can access the application forms from either the main office, Gatehouse or from the my BMG Parent Portal under 'Documents/Whole School'.

Conveyance Allowance Information

Families in rural and regional Victoria can get help with the cost of transporting their children to their nearest school or campus. This is known as the Conveyance Allowance.

The Conveyance Allowance is available to students travelling by:

- public transport
- private car
- private bus

whose nearest school is not serviced by a free school bus.

The Conveyance Allowance is a contribution towards transport costs and is not intended to cover the full cost of transporting children to and from school.

Conveyance Allowance continued.....

Eligibility

The conveyance allowance is available to families who meet certain criteria.

Students attending a school must:

- attend their nearest government or non-government school/campus appropriate to their year level at which admission is permissible;
- be enrolled at a school/campus outside Melbourne's metropolitan conveyance boundary for 3 or more days per week;
- reside 4.8 km or more by the shortest practicable route from that school/campus attended; and
- be of school age at the time of application and reside in Victoria.

Please note that a Private Bus or Private Car conveyance allowance is not available if the journey could have been made using a free school bus or public transport service.

Following a recent decision by the Student Transport Unit of the Education Department, it appears that there may be some movement in the way the Department makes a judgement on what is the nearest appropriate school.

If your decision to send your children to Bacchus Marsh Grammar was because you felt that it was the nearest appropriate school that respected ecumenical values but did not require your child to participate in religious instruction or religious celebration, then you may (subject to other Conveyance Allowance rules) be eligible for the Conveyance Allowance.

If this statement applies to you, whilst I can make no guarantees, I believe it is in your interests to submit a Conveyance Allowance Application for 2021. Application forms are available from the main office and from the Parent Portal. The application should be accompanied by a simple letter stating that you believe Bacchus Marsh Grammar is the nearest appropriate school because of its values and its lack of a requirement to participate in religious instruction or religious celebration of any particular faith.
