Prep to Year 4 update - Maddingley and Woodlea

The importance of reading for children cannot be underestimated. When students read aloud to a parent or carer, they have the opportunity to explore perceptions, values and attitudes through a shared conversation about the text they are reading.

At Bacchus Marsh Grammar, students are required to read aloud to a parent or carer for 10 to 15 minutes each day as part of their homework routine. This enables students to share and engage with the text and to practise important reading behaviours and comprehension skills including:

- Fluency reading aloud with consistent speed, accuracy and expression,
- Vocabulary Development acquiring and understanding new words within texts,
- **Comprehension** gaining a complete understanding of various meanings within texts including: literal (information directly stated); inferential (information that is implied); critical and evaluative (personal judgements and opinions about the information).

The Reading Reflection Journal allows students to keep a record of their daily reading which is then checked by their teachers.

Students are also encouraged to reflect on their reading and the Reading Journal provides suggestions for a variety of strategies students can use. Reflections give students the opportunity to develop a deeper understanding of their reading. This can be achieved through conversations between the student and their parent or carer, or by completing the reading reflection table in their Journal.

Senior School News

We are looking forward to students returning from online learning next week and anticipating the buzz of the classroom and getting to see all our students in person! I would encourage all students to attempt to ensure they are up to date with class work for Monday and are ready to continue with their learning. Use the weekend to recharge and prepare for the rest of Term 3.

For our Unit 3 and 4 students, the Victorian Curriculum Assessment Authority (VCAA) has stated that the General Achievement Test (GAT) has been rescheduled to Thursday 12 August 2021. The rescheduling of the GAT allows schools time to organise logistics and put COVIDSafe protocols in place so that students and staff can return and participate safely onsite. Information relating to health requirements and expectations will be released to students in due course.

Also, for Unit 3 and 4 students, VCAA has offered Consideration for Educational Disadvantage (CED) to students of 2021. The CED process takes into account the disruption to student learning caused by the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. It applies to every student completing one or more VCE or scored VCE VET Unit 3 – 4 sequences in 2021 (including Year 11 and 10 students). This process aids in restoring students' results to where they would have been without the disruptions that have occurred throughout the year and makes sure that final VCE results are valid and fair for all students. All students completing a Unit 3 and 4 subject will be supported in making this application. This, along with other processes, will allow our Unit 3 and 4 students to be supported in overcoming the issues faced this year.

Conveyance Allowance

Conveyance Allowance Semester One 2021 Payment

Travel Conveyance Allowance payments have now been made via EFT into parents nominated bank accounts for Semester One, 2021

What is Conveyance Allowance?

Families in rural and regional Victoria can get help with the cost of transporting their children to their nearest school or campus.

The Conveyance Allowance is available to students travelling by:

- public transport
- private car
- private bus if their nearest school is not serviced by a free school bus.

The Conveyance Allowance is a contribution towards transport costs and is not intended to cover the full cost of transporting children to and from school.

Eligibility

The conveyance allowance is available to families who meet certain criteria.

Students attending a school must:

- attend their nearest government or non-government school/campus appropriate to their year level at which admission is permissible;
- be enrolled at a school/campus outside Melbourne's metropolitan conveyance boundary for 3 or more days per week;
- reside 4.8km or more by the shortest practicable route from that school/campus; and
- be of school age at the time of application and reside in Victoria.

Please note that a Private Bus or Private Car conveyance allowance is not available if the journey could have been made using a free school bus or public transport service.

Following a recent decision by the Student Transport Unit of the Education Department, it appears that there may be some movement in the way the Department makes a judgement on what is the nearest appropriate school.

If your decision to send your children to Bacchus Marsh Grammar was because you felt that it was the nearest appropriate school that both respected ecumenical values and did not require your child to participate in religious instruction or religious celebration, then you may (subject to other Conveyance Allowance rules) be eligible for the Conveyance Allowance.

If this statement applies to you, whilst I can make no guarantees, I believe it in your interest to submit a Conveyance Allowance Application for 2021.

Application forms are available from the main office and from the Parent Portal. The application should be <u>accompanied</u> <u>by a simple letter</u> stating the reason that you believe Bacchus Marsh Grammar is the nearest appropriate school because of its values and its lack of a requirement to participate in religious instruction or religious celebration of any particular faith.

Please note: if you have already submitted an application for 2021, you are not required to complete another application unless your details have changed. For more information on the Conveyance Allowance, please refer to the School's Business Notice.
