# **Parent Teacher Interviews**

#### Maddingley Middle School (Year 5 to 8) and Senior School (Year 9 to 12) Interviews

## **BMG Reading Decathlon Challenge**

I recently came across a quote from American intellectual, Mason Cooley, who stated that 'reading gives us some place to go, when we have to stay where we are.' In our current circumstances, this really resonated.

We know that reading can be life-changing for children of any age. Studies examining the habits of kindergarten to Year 12 students have found that just six extra minutes of reading time per day can help a struggling reader reach – and even surpass – the year level's benchmark. Students in the same study, who read for 15 minutes or more per day, improved their reading skills at an accelerated rate. Research also clearly indicates the positive impact of having reading role models in the home and at school, highlighting the importance of establishing a reading culture among families and the influence this can have on determining literacy outcomes for children.

Students of today are faced with many modes of entertainment and live in a fast-paced, information rich world. They have vast technology at their fingertips and can find answers to their questions in seconds with a quick Google search. In many ways, it is understandable that reading for pleasure has taken a backseat for some of them, but it is vital that we encourage students to read as much as possible and do what we can to instil a love for reading that they can take through life. There really is no other skill as important.

In an endeavour to motivate students to increase their reading, we are running an exciting competition for the next few weeks. The Bacchus Marsh

Grammar Reading Decathlon Challenge is open to all students from Prep to Year 12 and we encourage you to get involved by supporting and encouraging your children to participate. The Challenge consists of ten 'events' aimed to encourage reading and literacy in the lead up to Literacy Week in Week 8 of this term.

In designing this competition, we have taken inspiration from the amazing Decathlon Bronze Medal performance of Ashley Moloney, who last week became the first Australian in history to place at the Olympics in this event. Just as the varied nature of the decathlon allows athletes to demonstrate great skill and versatility, providing a variety of literacy experiences at home and at school affords children the same opportunity to shine.

# Junior School – Maddingley & Woodlea



Numeracy is the knowledge, skills, behaviours and dispositions that students need in order to use mathematics in a wide range of real life situations. It involves recognising and understanding how mathematics can be applied in the world and having the capacity to use mathematical knowledge and skills purposefully. Mathematics gives students access to important mathematical ideas, knowledge and skills, while numeracy connects this learning with their personal and work lives.

Number and algebra, measurement and geometry, and statistics and probability are the three areas of mathematics that we teach and assess to achieve our curriculum standards.

While much of the teaching of concepts and skills to support numeracy happens in the mathematics learning area, it is strengthened as students take part in learning experiences that connect their learning in the mathematics classroom within the context of other curriculum areas.

Bacchus Marsh Grammar values, such as confidence and discipline, also support achievement in numeracy.

At home, you can strengthen your students' understanding of numeracy by including them in real world mathematics. Can students help you calculate which is the cheaper option at the supermarket? Include students in cooking and gardening embedding mathematics concepts into family activities. Ensure you use mathematical vocabulary in everyday life, including your children in the rich learning opportunities at home.


