

NAPLAN 2022

From 2022, all schools are required to transition from the previous paper-based NAPLAN tests to the computer-based assessment. NAPLAN online provides a better assessment and is more engaging for students. It is a tailored test that adapts to student responses, presenting students with questions that may be more or less difficult – resulting in more precise results.

To prepare students in Years 3, 5, 7 & 9 for the computer-based assessment, schools are required to administer a Practice Test before April 22. The Practice Test does not collect data on student achievement, it is only intended to test the capacity of networks and the NAPLAN online platform, as well as providing students with an opportunity to become familiar with the new online format. For some NAPLAN online tests, students will be able to use headphones to have questions read to them. *The school will provide headphones for the actual NAPLAN assessment in May, but students are encouraged to bring their own headphones for the practice test this term.*

Students in Year 9 at Maddingley, and Year 7 at Woodlea, will complete their Practice Test on Thursday 24 March, with other year levels to follow later in the term.

We encourage students and families to access the National Assessment Program public demonstration test to further familiarise themselves with the types of questions and related functionalities available in the online NAPLAN assessment. Visit of Chief Assessor for VCE English, Karen Graham

BMG was privileged to host a professional learning session with the English Chief Assessor Karen Graham. Ms Graham worked with the Year 12 teaching staff to explore strategies for promoting and achieving excellence in Year 12 English.

'The exam's the thing!'

Ms Graham emphasised the importance of an exam focus throughout the year. While success in coursework is important, the exam should be the students' and teachers' primary focus. Although technically 50% of a student's mark comes from the exam, Ms Graham explained that, in practice, this can be as high as 60-70% because the exam results moderate the internal assessments. She shared strategies adopted by other successful schools – these included such things as voluntary Saturday exams. Writing many responses in timed conditions is also key to achieving excellence.



"Find your voice!"

The importance of an individual reading of texts, rather than relying on commercial study guides, was also highlighted. The examiners are familiar with the commercial study guides and do not reward responses that rely on these notes. A deep knowledge of the text, proactive engagement in English classes and listening to teacher feedback are key.

"English is the easiest subject to improve in!"

Although it is competitive and challenging to achieve excellent results in English, Ms Graham believes that the best way to improve your overall ATAR is to improve your English result. Whilst recognising the challenges involved for both staff and students, Ms Graham emphasised the many rewards that come with reaching your goals and striving for your personal best in English.

Karen Graham is returning to BMG later in Term 1 for more staff development.

We thank you in advance for supporting the students in understanding that discipline means setting limits and encouraging positive behaviour.

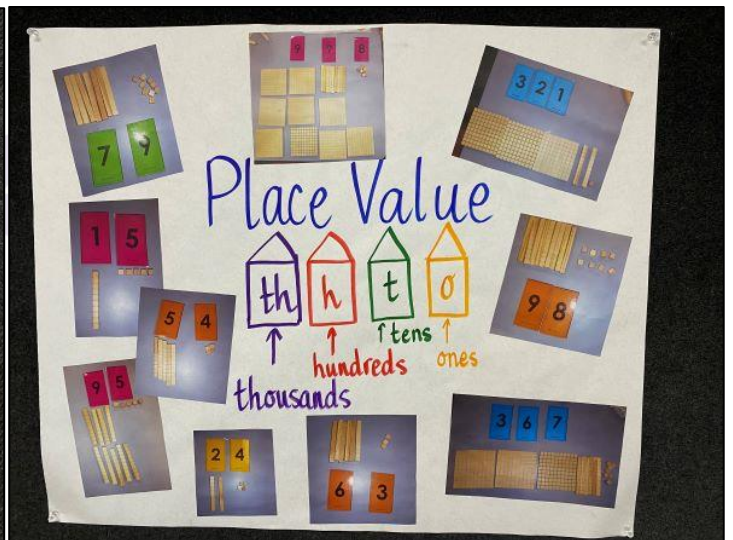

Spotlight on Year 1 Woodlea

Last week, the Year 1 students at Woodlea explored *The Magic Hat*, written by Mem Fox. They enjoyed learning new vocabulary and responding to the text in various ways. The students were immersed in designing and describing their own magic hats, thinking critically, and problem-solving.

The Year 1 students have been exploring the concept of place value through lots of hands-on experiences. They have used a variety of concrete materials to demonstrate their understanding of place value when working with whole numbers. Students have had the opportunity to build on their mathematical language through rich discussions, allowing them to explain their thinking processes.

Spotlight on Year 3 Maddingley

History and Geography - World Rivers



The Year 3 students are learning about world rivers and their impact on civilisation as we know it today. They are exploring and understanding why people have always gravitated to and settled along the rivers and streams of the world. Using maps, a globe and the student booklet, students are investigating each of the seven continents and learning how rivers supply water for drinking, bathing, laundering, irrigation, recreation, transportation, and how they are an important source of food.

Students are applying their geographical knowledge and are gathering information about rivers to understand the emergence of early and advanced civilizations. They are in the process of discovering that rivers often establish natural boundaries between states, countries, provinces and districts, and sculpt our planet.

Some key vocabulary words that we are focusing on in History and Geography are; source, mouth, drainage basin, tributary and civilisation

Wind in the Willows

Students are engaging in the adventures of Mole, Rat, Badger and Toad in selections from *The Wind in the Willows*. Reading, listening and participating in associated activities reinforces their understanding of story elements and introduces new, rich vocabulary, language and syntax.

Students are learning literary terms such as author, characters, setting, plot, dialogue, personification, point of view, perspective, themes and narration. Students are investigating the author's central message, lesson or moral, and explain how it is conveyed through key details in the text.

Some key vocabulary words that we are focusing on for Reading are: meandered, dejected, possessed, postpone, summoned, subtle, forage and hesitating.

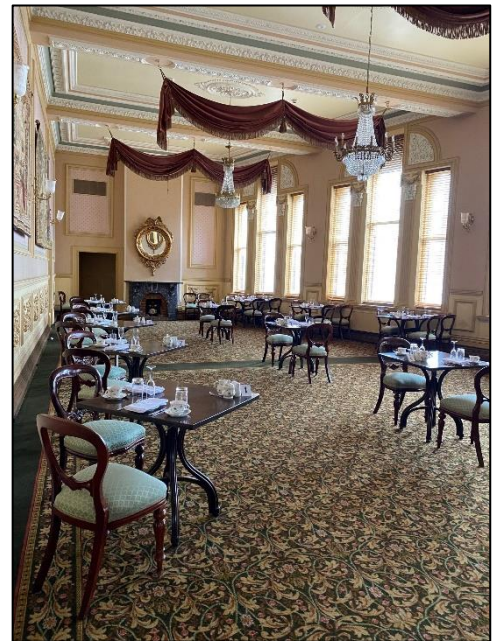

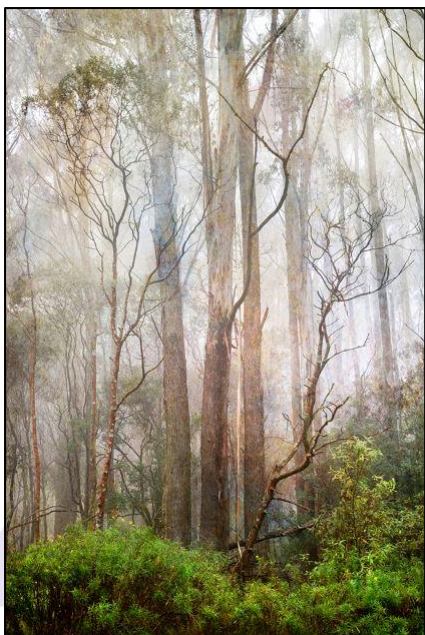
News from the Hospitality Department

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) – Applications for 2022

Information was emailed to families in February relating to the CSEF. This is applicable to families who hold a valid Centrelink pensioner concession or Health care card number (CRN). The CSEF application form can be downloaded from the School's website: <https://www.bmg.vic.edu.au/community/camps-sports-excursions-fund-csef/>.

To encourage people to make an application, the School will provide a rebate equivalent to the Building Levy for those families who submit applications which are approved by The Department of Education and Training.

The form which outlines eligibility requirements needs to be returned to the School by 17th June 2022 (last day of Term 2). Parents must meet the eligibility requirements by:

1. Eligibility Date: 31 January 2022
2. 2nd CRN validation date (for failed CRNs only): 26 April 2022

Parents who received the CSEF at Bacchus Marsh Grammar in 2021 do not need to complete an application form in 2022, providing there has been no change to their family circumstances.

Students who return to school after their seven day isolation with a COVID-19 infection do not need to do Rapid Antigen Testing for a 30 day period.

Late Buses

Maddingley Campus

As of Monday 21 March, the Maddingley late bus will operate Monday afternoons, which is additional to the services already underway on Wednesday and Thursday afternoons. The late bus departs at 4.40pm. There are two buses allocated: **Late Bus 1** covers Melton, Caroline Springs and Tarneit. **Late Bus 2** covers Manor Lakes, Werribee and Hoppers Crossing. Please refer to the [school website](#) to access the timetables. The late bus is available for students in Year 4 to Year 12 only. **Students are required to write their name on the sign-up sheet at Reception for their relevant Late Bus (1 or 2), under the stop they will disembark. This must be done before the end of lunch on the day of travel.** Students must be involved in an afterschool class or activity to travel on the late bus. The cost of the late bus is \$15 per trip.

Student ID Cards

All students have now received their Student ID cards. These must be placed on or in each student school bag in order for students to tap on/off the bus each morning and afternoon as part of the Roll Call system. Students who do not have their ID card for bus travel will be reported to the Year Level Coordinator.

Mask Wearing

It is compulsory for ALL students in Year 3 to Year 12 to wear a fitted face mask whilst they are travelling on a school bus, (this includes to and from school, excursions and camps), unless they have a medical exemption. It is not compulsory for students in Year 2 and under to wear a face mask on the bus, although it is highly recommended.

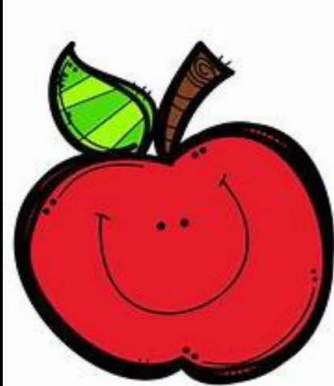
