## 2021 ICAS Medal Winner



ICAS is a school-based competition that students from Australia and international schools sit annually across six subject areas – English, Mathematics, Science, Spelling Bee, Writing and Digital Technologies, and which is administered in thousands of schools across the globe.

Victoria gained 151 first-place medals, including 11 double medal winners in 2021, in one of the largest and most prestigious global academic competitions for school students,

Students with the top score in each year level in each subject are awarded an ICAS medal and a medal winner's certificate. In Australia, the state by state medal tally was: New South Wales (169), Victoria (151), Queensland (132), SA (101), WA (89), Tasmania (64), ACT (19) and NT (10). New Zealand gained 125 medals.

Congratulations to **Maddox Edwards** who participated in ICAS 2021 and was awarded a first-place medal for Year 10 Mathematics.

## **Swinburne Early Leaders**



Amongst the challenges of another COVID year in 2021, Year 11 students at the time – now current Year 12 students, had the opportunity to engage in the Swinburne Early Leaders' program. This program was to be completed, in addition to the students' usual academic demands, as a part of the Critical and Creative Thinking Program in a mostly remote-learning scenario.

Students were required to complete an Academic Paper (that was graded by Swinburne Academics) setting out their anticipated transition experiences from secondary studies into tertiary studies. Students also completed a Career Development Unit which was designed

to help increase their future goals for their Year 12 studies and beyond. Some students even took the option of completing the Creativity and Community Engagement Units.

All in all, these students embraced another challenge for their personal growth and development and we would like to thank Swinburne University for piloting the Early Leaders' Schools' Stream at our school.

Lauren Steer from Swinburne University attended the Senior School Assembly on Monday to award the BMG Early Leaders with their Achievement Packages. 



## **Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) – Applications for 2022**

Information was emailed to families in February relating to the CSEF. This is applicable to families who hold a valid Centrelink pensioner concession or Health care card number (CRN). The CSEF application form can be downloaded from the School's website: <u>https://www.bmg.vic.edu.au/community/camps-sports-excursions-fund-csef/.</u>

To encourage people to make an application, the School will provide a rebate equivalent to the Building Levy for those families who submit applications which are approved by The Department of Education and Training.

The form which outlines eligibility requirements needs to be returned to the School by 17<sup>th</sup> June 2022 (last day of Term 2). Parents must meet the eligibility requirements by:

- 1. Eligibility Date: 31 January 2022
- 2. 2nd CRN validation date (for failed CRNs only): 26 April 2022

Parents who received the CSEF at Bacchus Marsh Grammar in 2021 do not need to complete an application form in 2022, providing there has been no change to their family circumstances.
