Mobile Phones

A reminder to parents/guardians that students are **not permitted** to use their mobile phone during the school day. Phones are to be placed in the locker on arrival to school. Currently, there are too many students contacting parents to come and collect them from school. Should your child be unwell, they are to attend the Health Centre. The School Nurse will make contact with a parent should this be deemed necessary. If your child contacts you requesting to be collected, <u>please refrain from arriving at school</u>. As your child is in breach of our mobile phone policy, they will be issued an afterschool detention.

Should your child need to make contact home for any reason other than illness, they can speak to their Year Level Coordinator or the staff at Reception and this can be managed accordingly.

Uniform

Parents/guardians are again reminded to check the school uniform policy, particularly regarding our school sports uniform. Students are only permitted to wear sports uniform to school on days they have PE/Sport practical classes (not for theory classes). BMG logo tracksuit pants are to be worn with the polo shirt and rugby jumper with correct sports shoes. Casual street shoes are not permitted. Undergarments (ie long sleeved tops) are not to be visible under the polo shirt.

Students in Elite Sport classes are to get changed for class on Mondays only.

School blazers are to be worn to and from school **EVERY** day. Please ensure your child is correctly attired before they leave home in the morning.

Students out of uniform MUST provide a note in the diary from a parent with an explanation of why their child is not correctly attired for the school day. Students who are consistently out of uniform will receive an afterschool detention.

Public Transport

Bacchus Marsh Grammar has a number of students who travel to and from school on public transport, be that public bus or train. Parents are encouraged to remind their child/ren how to appropriately behave, especially when in public.

Students should:

- stand and offer their seat to adults/elderly patrons;
- be mindful of their language;
- be respectful of others around them; and
- represent BMG with pride and be an advocate for the school.

ICAS Assessments – Final Reminder

The last assessment for 2022 is for **Mathematics** on Saturday 27 August.

VCE English

Revision Period Begins

With oral presentations complete, Year 12 English students have been busily preparing for their final SAC of the year. This last written task will require students to conduct a detailed comparison of two set texts 'The Hate Race' by Maxine Beneba Clarke, and 'Charlie's Country' an acclaimed film directed by Rolf de Heer. In their final lesson of Week 5 students attended a master class led by one of our Year 12 English teachers, Leigh Radbourne. Leigh provided students with the inside scoop on how to do well in their upcoming SAC from the perspective of a VCE English assessor. The comparative assessment will take place in the last session of Week 9.

As the revision period commences, the Year 12 English team would like to encourage students to decorate their space at home with posters and notes to prompt their thinking. In English, students must memorise a selection of quotes and authorial choices from 'Station Eleven,' 'The Hate Race' and 'Charlie's Country.' Please encourage your child to use their time wisely by writing practice pieces which they then submit to their teacher for feedback, and memorising evidence from their set texts. Teachers are busily preparing a rigorous program of revision which will commence in Week 10, providing students with explicit teaching of the key knowledge and skills required to ace the examination.

Elite Sport Testing

Well done to all students who have attended the two testing afternoons over the last two weeks. We have seen a wonderful turnout, with over 90 students participating in the different testing protocols. The benchmarks for each fitness test have been posted in the Gym for students to see how they fared. This data will now be collated with other selection criteria to assist with making selections.

Information regarding successful candidates will be released over the coming weeks after the review process has been completed by our panel of staff which consists of former Commonwealth Games, National level and high-performance Coaches and an independent review from the WestVic Academy of Sport Executive Officer and team.

Unfortunately, we cannot offer a place to all candidates. However, we encourage all athletes to continue to train hard and strive for success. As in previous years we will review all applications and grade each one on the following criteria:

- 1. Level of competition the athlete has consistently been competing.
- 2. Quality of the athlete coach's reference.
- 3. Performance of the athlete at the testing afternoons and meeting benchmarks.
- 4. Commitment to representing the school in events (e.g. ICCES) within their athletic capabilities.
- 5. Approach to studies, attitude and results within Physical Education and Sport classes.
- 6. Behaviour and approach to studies within their academic subjects.
- 7. Meeting subject selection criteria as per the requirements of the year 9/10 elective program.

The standard of applicants was extremely high once again with a large number of athletes achieving either National or State representation within their chosen sport.


Moving on from our Ancient civilizations of Egypt and Mesopotamia, we are now looking a little closer to home. Students are beginning to learn about the history of the Earth. This unit begins with an understanding of our town, our state, our country, and our continent and then moves into the Earth and its layers. Students will also explore rocks, minerals, volcanoes, and dinosaurs, providing them with many opportunities to apply and share their knowledge.

We have had a strong focus on vocabulary throughout the term with students applying this new knowledge to their oral language and writing. Students love using their whiteboards to practice new

words using 'Tick it or fix it.' Recently they were introduced to the word's 'fret' and 'triumph'. They were able to use these words when reflecting on texts they had read and by making personal connections about a time they began to fret. It is exciting to see their writing develop and their vocabulary expand.

Stop Allocations

If you have changed your child's stop which they board or disembark from as a permanent change, please advise the School Bus Service Administrator on 03 5366 4800 so this information can be updated on Roll Call and assist in the planning for the 2023 routes/timetables.

Roll Call - no need to make a change for one-off absence

If students are absent for the day/a period of time or not travelling on the bus as a once off, parents DO NOT need to remove their child from Roll Call. If a student does not travel, it will appear on Roll Call as NOT TRAVELLED. If a parent removes their child for a once off travel, it can remove the child from being allocated to the bus completely.

Private Bus Travel 2023

We are currently rolling students over from 2022 private bus travel to 2023 private bus travel.

If your child/ren's current bus travel arrangements are going to change or require to be changed (eg. Moving house, new address will no longer require a private bus) in 2023 please contact the School Bus Services Administrator on 5366 4800 or email to discuss. 
