



Hip, Hip, Hooray! It is 100 days!


100 days of school is here, 100 days of talking loud and clear,

Spotlight on Woodlea Year 2

Throughout the second half of Term 2, as well as the start of Term 3, our amazing Year 2 students have been exploring writing in different non-fictional modes.



Investigating Informative Writing, students produced creatively titled reports on insects of their choice, providing their audience with a wealth of information on the habitats, diet, anatomy, habits and life cycles of some of Earth's smallest creatures.

From there, students explored the different types of procedural writing they might encounter in real world settings and the changed purpose and audiences for such texts. Instructions for Lego, recipes for delicious snacks and drinks and how to get organised for the day provided some rich contexts for their own learning about procedural writing.

Phonological and Phonemic Awareness Bright Idea – Syllables




Syllable shopping

While at the supermarket or shopping centre, have your child tell you the syllables in different food names. Have them hold up a finger for each word part. Eggplant = egg-plant, two syllables. Pineapple = pine-ap-ple, three syllables.

Show your child the picture or sign for each item and ask him/her to say the word.

Spotlight on Maddingley Year 4





Students in Year 4 at Maddingley have been learning about Global Sustainability. Students have learned how natural resources, such as wood, coal, oil, natural gas, cotton, animals, sun, wind and water are important in our everyday lives. They have learned that some of these resources are renewable and will keep reproducing so humans can use these infinitely; however, many resources are non-renewable and therefore need to be conserved.

Students have also learned that sustainability is everything that we need for our survival and wellbeing and, directly or indirectly, comes from our land and environment. To protect these resources, we need to reduce, reuse and recycle as much of these as we can so, as a class project, students worked individually or in groups to invent ways in which to reuse plastic water bottles. Our students came up with some amazing ideas.

During reading lessons, the students are responding critically to several books referencing sustainability. As part of a Visual Literacy study and continuation of their connection to sustainability, they are watching and completing tasks relating to 'Oddball' the movie.

During the remainder of the term, our Year 4s will learn about Aboriginal sustainability, deforestation, overfishing and waste management. This is an exciting unit of work that our Year 4s can use to educate their family and friends in order to make our world a better place in which to live.

Reading vocabulary: morpheme, base word, free morphemes, bound morphemes, prefixes, suffixes, climate change, renewable, non-renewable, deforestation, pollution.

Writing vocabulary: Persuasive Text – argument, conclusion, introduction, modality words, rhetorical question.

Numeracy vocabulary: Time and Data – analogue, digital, elapsed time, ante meridiem, post meridiem.

History & Geography vocabulary: Sustainability – consequence, non-renewable, renewable, resources, sustainable.



Bus Information

Mask Wearing on Buses

Under the Public Safety Act, masks must be worn by all students travelling on a commercial passenger vehicle (buses) for ages 8 and above, unless the student has a medical exception. This applies to travel to and from school, excursions and camps. Passengers 8 years and under do not require to wear a mask but is highly recommended.

Authorised Officers are in enforce around Metropolitan and Regional areas issuing fines to Private and Public Operated buses for anyone not wearing a mask.

Seat Belt Wearing on Buses

Seat belts are fitted to buses and it is the law in Victoria to wear seat belts where fitted. If any students are found not to be wearing their seat belt, they will be dealt with according to the behavioural management steps in the Student Bus Travel Code of Conduct.

Student ID Cards

A reminder ALL students MUST carry their Student ID cards with them to and from School. Students who travel via private bus must use their Student ID Card to tap on/off the bus each morning and afternoon. Students who travel without their Student ID card will be sent to their Year Level Co-Coordinator. Students who do not have a student ID card are required to go to ICT to obtain a new card.

Student ID cards are now required for ALL students to tap on/off the bus when attending an excursion or camp.
