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The School

The school is a member of Ecumenical Schools Australia and is not-for-profit company limited by guarantee. The school is governed by a School Board, the Board's role is to develop and ensure the long-term viability of the school. It achieves this through the setting of policy, the employment of the Principal (who is responsible for the operation of the school) and the maintenance of systems of accountability.

The school will have as its primary goal over that time the delivery of higher amounts of "value adding". That is, the school will endeavour to develop a range of educational, social and co-curricular programs that make recognisable differences to the outcomes for individual students. 2024 POST SCHOOL DESTINATIONS AND TERTIARY AWARDS

Tertiary Destinations varied from our recent Year 12 Graduates. From a total of 184 students enrolled in the Victorian Certificate of Education, 166 (90.21%) elected to make an application for tertiary studies via the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC). 164 (98.80%) students received an offer to study at a Victorian University after all offer rounds and some students also received interstate offers. 11 students elected to pursue a combination of part-time/casual work, 4 secured full time apprenticeships and 3 students had received early offers to study at private colleges.




COURSE OFFERS MADE BY PREFERENCE ORDER AFTER ALL OFFER ROUND:

STUDENT OFFERS BY PREFERENCE NUMBER





VCE Results 2023

VCE Results for 2023 were very pleasing. The Average Study Score increased from 31 to 32 and the percentage of Scores greater than 40 from 9.8% to 11.4%. The Dux was Jack Buskens with an ATAR of 99.3, closely followed by Dux Proximit Kieran Todd with an ATAR of 99.2. Scores over 99 were also received by Maddox Edwards (99.10) and Anahita Rahman (99.15). it could be argued that these results are equal to our best ever.

A particular pleasing result saw five students obtain Perfect Scores of 50. Two of those students were Year 10 students. Another 5 students gained scores of 48 or 49. All of these scores were obtained by Year 10 and 11 students. Scores of 48 or better were achieved in Further Mathematics, Maths Methods, Music, Biology and Health and Human Development.

2023's VCE results included 117 scores of 40 or more, and a perfect study score of 50 was achieved by five students:

STUDENTS

Bacchus Marsh Grammar is a school of Western Melbourne with a catchment that extends from Williamstown to Ballarat and Gisborne to Werribee. Major concentrations of students are found in Bacchus Marsh, Werribee, Point Cook and Aintree.

Over the past 36 years the School has grown to have a student population of 3,383 - 2,319 at the Maddingley Campus and 1064 students at the Woodlea Campus.

Our student body is an accurate reflection of the "new West" and includes students from a diverse range of backgrounds and languages spoken at home. A particular feature of the School has been the growth in recent years of students who have a South Asian heritage.

The School has a small but growing number of students who are proud to claim an Indigenous heritage. The School actively seeks to increase the number of students of Indigenous background through a Scholarship Program.

Bacchus Marsh Grammar is a Member of Ecumenical Schools Australia. It is neither an organization of faith or one that disfavours faith altogether. It believes that a tolerance of all faiths is an important element of any education. It does so by an encouragement to tolerance rather than a requirement to learn any particular doctrine or creed.

STAFF

The key to any school is the quality and professional development of staff. Bacchus Marsh Grammar benefits from its diversity of staff, with a rich mixture of young teachers commencing their career and many experienced teachers who bring a strong understanding of what is required to make an excellent school. At present the school employs one staff member who are known or wish to be recognised of Torres Straight or Aboriginal background.

The school has a high staff retention rate of 92% and high levels of staff attendance of approximately 90%. Again, the major reason for staff changes during the year were either Maternity Leave or Long Service Leave. Staff retention remains particularly high across all sectors of the school.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Throughout 2023 the School was able to build on Community Engagement programs across all campuses. Students, staff, parents and guardians were provided with opportunities to connect and experience a broad range of community engagement activities and programs.

The Junior School Parent Helper Program recommenced and provided valued assistance to Junior School teaching staff and students. At both the Maddingley and Woodlea Campuses Parents and Guardians joined Junior School students for Easter Activities including Easter Bonnet Parades, Mother's and Father's Day classroom activities.

The reintroduction of Face-to-face Parent Teacher Interviews were welcomed giving staff, parents and guardians a more connected experience. Families were also able to see the growth and development of the school sites.

School study coursework and fieldtrips enabled students to engage with Environmental and Indigenous Educators, Parks Victoria Authorities and the wider community. Senior Students experienced a wide range of external knowledge and history through the Senior School Speakers Programme and Visiting community members. VCE-Vocational Major students embraced their community projects working with Grant lodge Aged Care developing edible gardens and reinvigorating garden areas.

The Maddingley Campus Careers Information Night and Expo was a great success providing students and families access to a wide variety of industry organisations and tertiary providers at the school.

Middle and Senior School Musical Productions Legally Blonde, Annie Junior and Shrek Junior provided avenues for students to be involved and gain experiences outside of the classroom in preforming arts and a range of supporting roles. Co-curricular, Camps and Experiences including international Exchange Programs continue to be a highlight and personal growth for students enabling the development of life skills beyond the classroom.

Annual celebrations including Year 12 Valedictory, Year 6 Graduations and Award Days celebrate student achievements and milestones in each students education journey. It is rewarding for the school to be able to share these events with the wider community

PARENT AND STUDENT SATISFACTION

There are a variety of ways in which schools can measure parent and student satisfaction.

Traditionally a model of parent/student survey or quantifiable information have been adopted as the primary means of data collection. Whilst of some validity, they are not without significant methodological problems. This includes issues with sample size and problems in relation to the profile of responses and non-responders being considerably different.

This school looks to measure parent and student satisfaction mainly using measure of qualitative information and measure of the range and style of communications that it receives from parents and students in relation to all aspects of student life. Analysis of this material is more complex, but it is felt that it gives information that is more reliable in forming a view of opinions within and about the school. The general trend of this material is supportive of the direction and operation of the school. This when linked to the most important source of advertising about the school is positive "word of mouth", paints a picture of a successful, happy (but not perfect) school. As in previous reports I stress that the best measure of satisfaction is the feedback from past students enjoying success in whatever path they take after school and the continued significant demand for places at the school.

Review of Operations

REVIEW OF OPERATIONS

Bacchus Marsh Grammar has operated profitably throughout the financial year achieving an operating surplus of \$12,754,020 (2022: \$12,717,322) which exceeded original budget expectations. The operating surplus supports educational delivery, servicing of debt, programmed maintenance, small projects, and the facilities management plan.

In 2023, Bacchus Marsh Grammar had enrolments of 3,383 students at the census date with 2,319 students attending the Maddingley campus and 1,064 students attending the Woodlea campus. The introduction of year 9 at the Woodlea campus in 2023 marks the beginning of Woodlea as a Senior School campus. The school employs approximately 401 full time, part time and casual staff.


The School Board remained committed to keeping the annual increase in tuition fees as low as possible to minimise cost-of-living pressures on its parent community while ensuring a consistent and reliable approach when setting fees. The 2023 fee increase was 5.1 per cent. The School received funding from Commonwealth and State Governments in accordance with their respective funding models.

The School's largest operating cost is employee expenses which are underpinned by an Enterprise Bargaining Agreement. Other significant expenses, many of which remain exposed to higher-than inflation market increases, include transport, insurance, property maintenance and regulatory compliance costs.


The School continued to invest in capital development during 2023 with the completion of the new Library/ Resource centre and additional staff car parking at the Maddingley Campus and the extension of the Reception and Administration area at the Woodlea Campus. During 2023, the School acquired additional land adjacent to the Woodlea campus allowing the school to build on the educational programs offerings at this campus.

Management and the Board, with support from its committees, continually monitor the financial performance of the School through monthly financial reporting, a robust budget process and annual review of the Schools long term strategic plan. William Buck have conducted the annual audit and have confirmed the 2023 Financial Statements present a true and fair view of the financial position of the School as at 31 December 2023.
